CALIFORNIA STATEWIDE VOTER SURVEY REPORT ON RESULTS

From Tuesday, January 24 through Wednesday, January 25, Probolsky Research conducted a telephone survey of likely November, 2012 General Election voters.

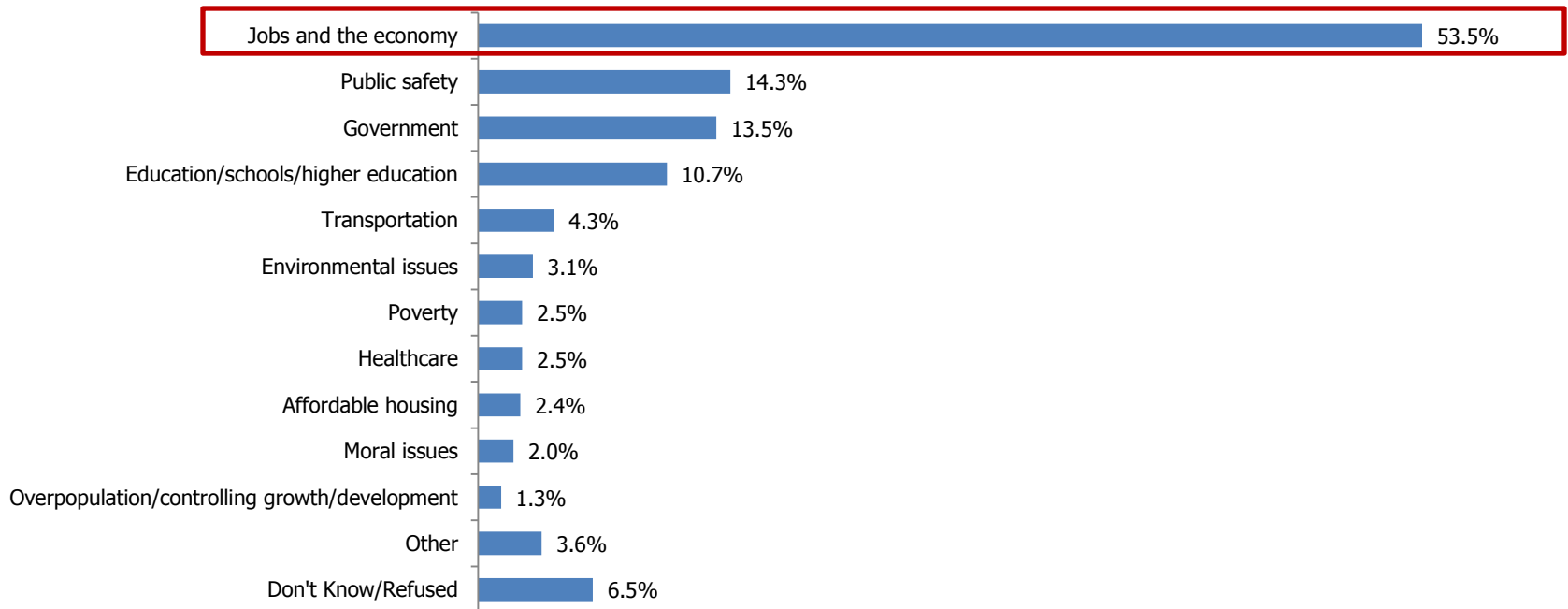
A total of 750 surveys were collected. A survey of this size yields a margin of error of +/-3.7% with a 95% degree of confidence.

Interviews were conducted in both English and Spanish with voters on both landline and cell phones.

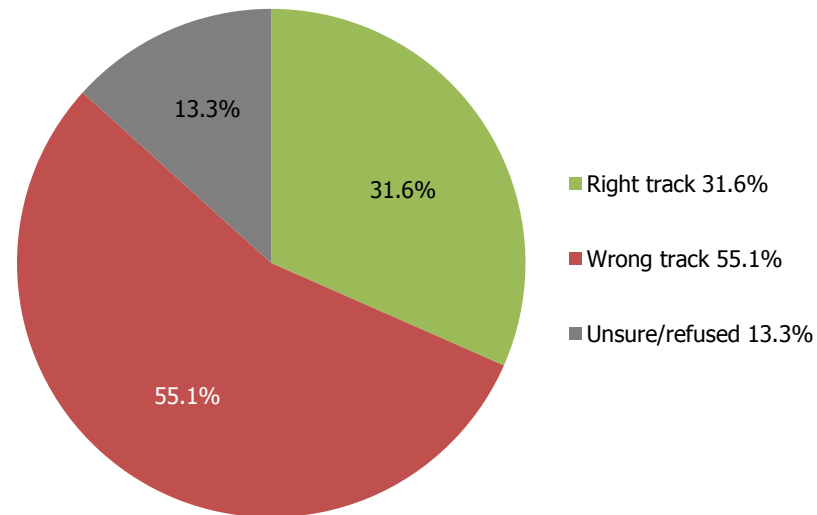
JOBS AND THE ECONOMY IS THE MOST IMPORTANT ISSUE TO CALIFORNIA VOTERS

55.1% OF RESPONDENTS BELIEVE THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA IS ON THE WRONG TRACK

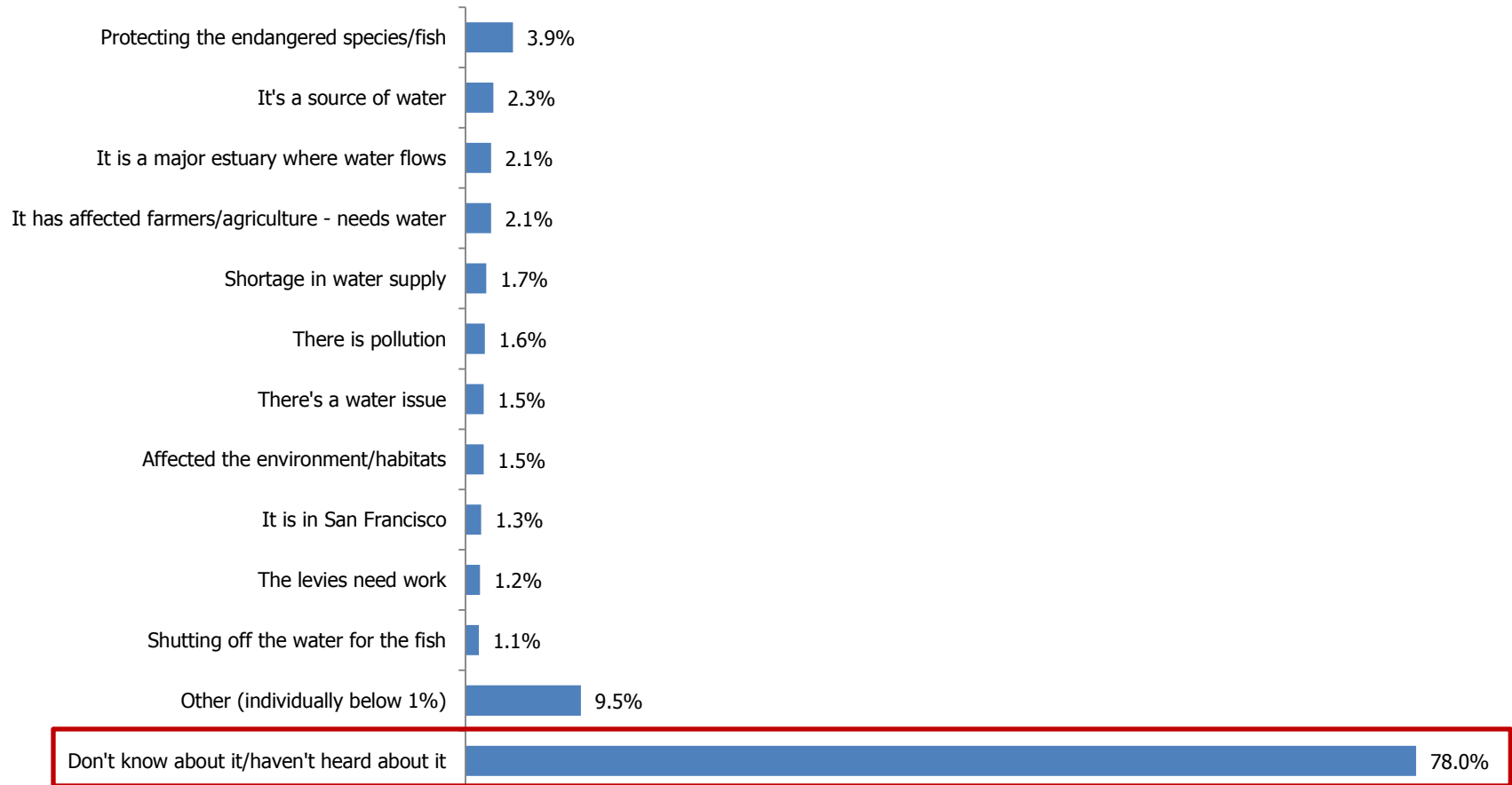
Question: Do you think that California is on the right track or on the wrong track?

WHAT DO PEOPLE REALLY KNOW About the Bay Delta? (sample of verbatim responses)

“They are trying to drain the water down to the southern end of California. I am against that because I don't want to see southern California get any more of our water.”

“I work in it. I'm a biologist and I am very aware of the issues.”

“I know that we get a significant amount of water from it. There are concerns about certain types of fishes and wildlife, so there have been injunctions and such. We try to conserve water due to it.”

much water for Southern California.”

“They shut it off. They shut off the water because of some dumb little fish that no one wants if that's what I think it is.”

“He is not a candidate in my concern.”

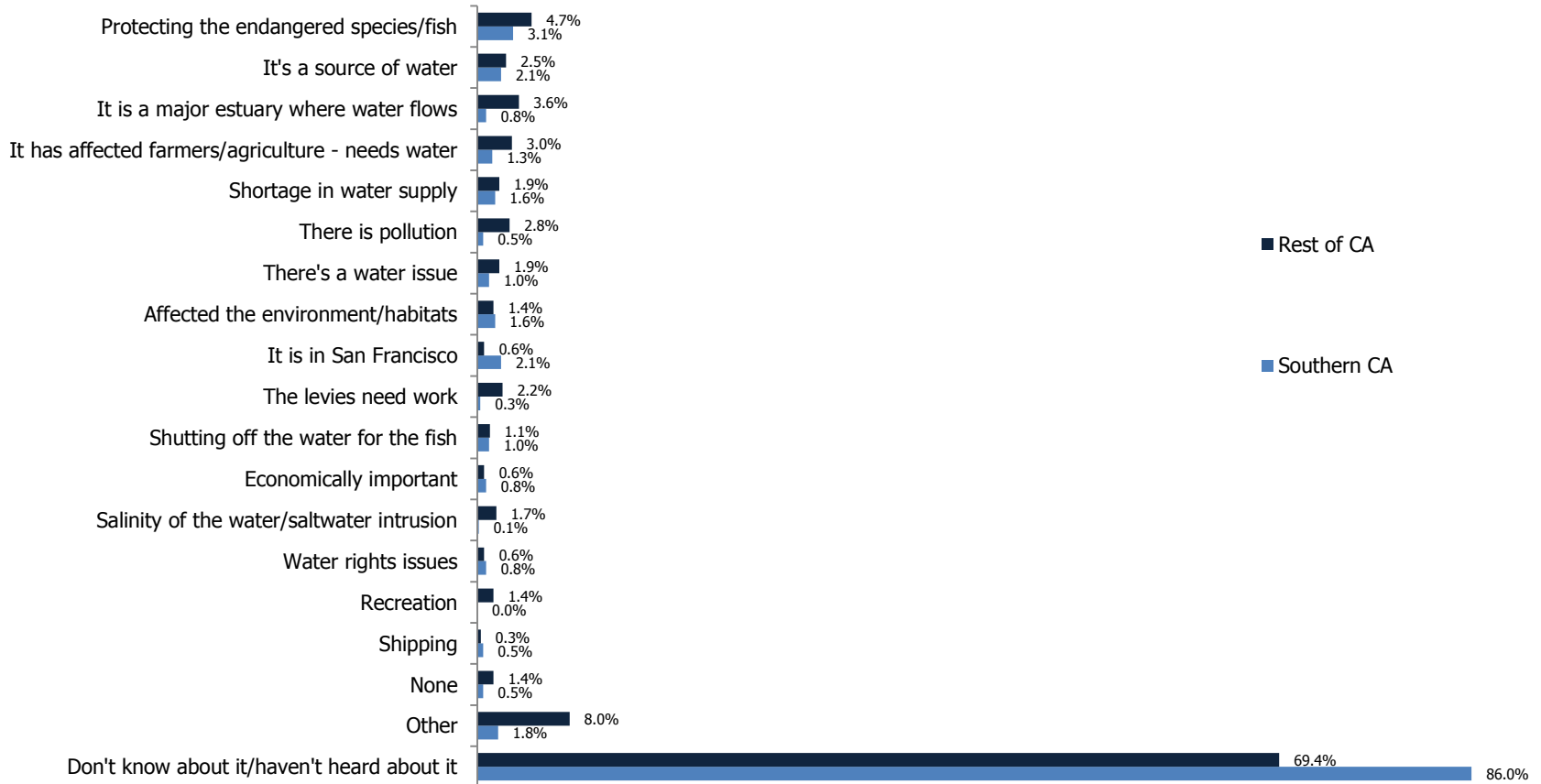

Question: Please tell me what you know about the Bay Delta? If you haven't heard of it or don't know, just says so.

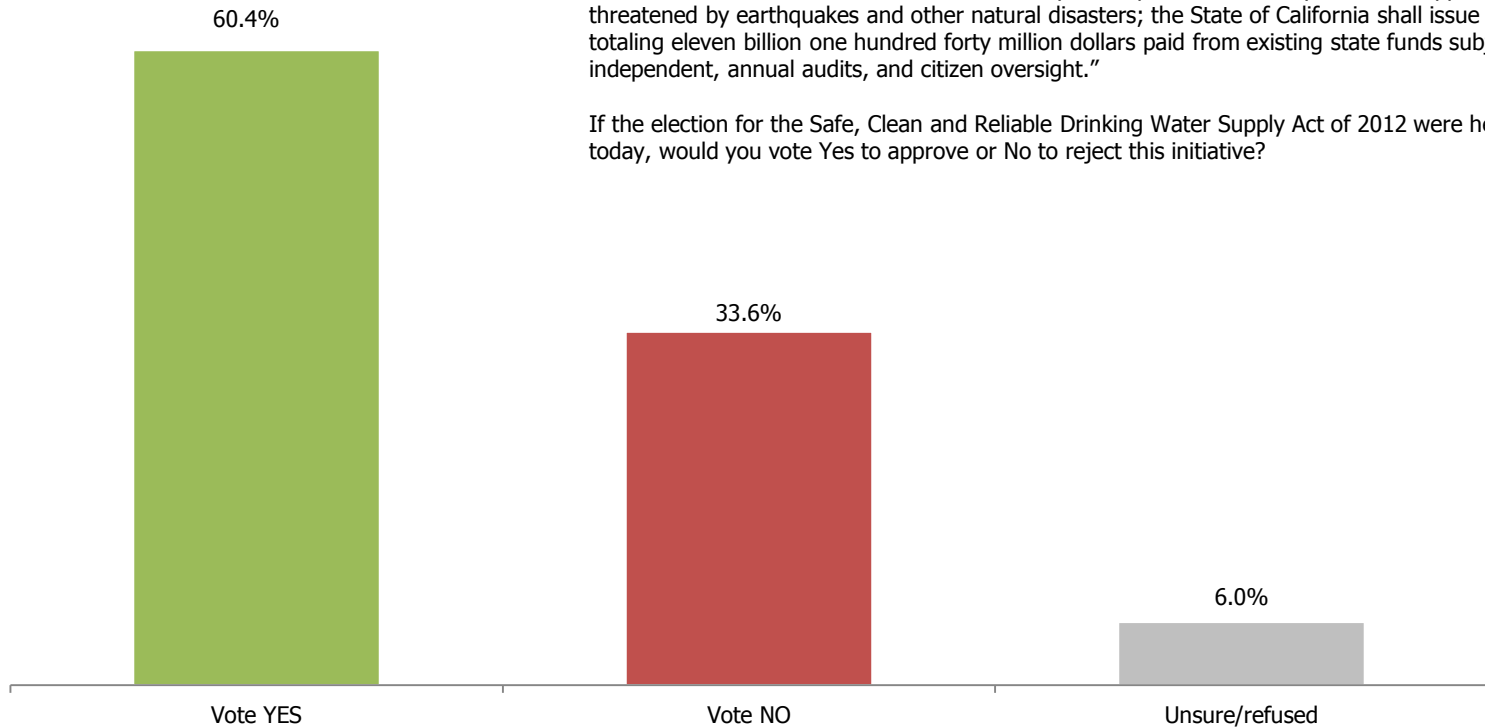


NEW POLL NUMBERS: 60.4% WOULD VOTE YES

In favor of the Safe, Clean and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2012

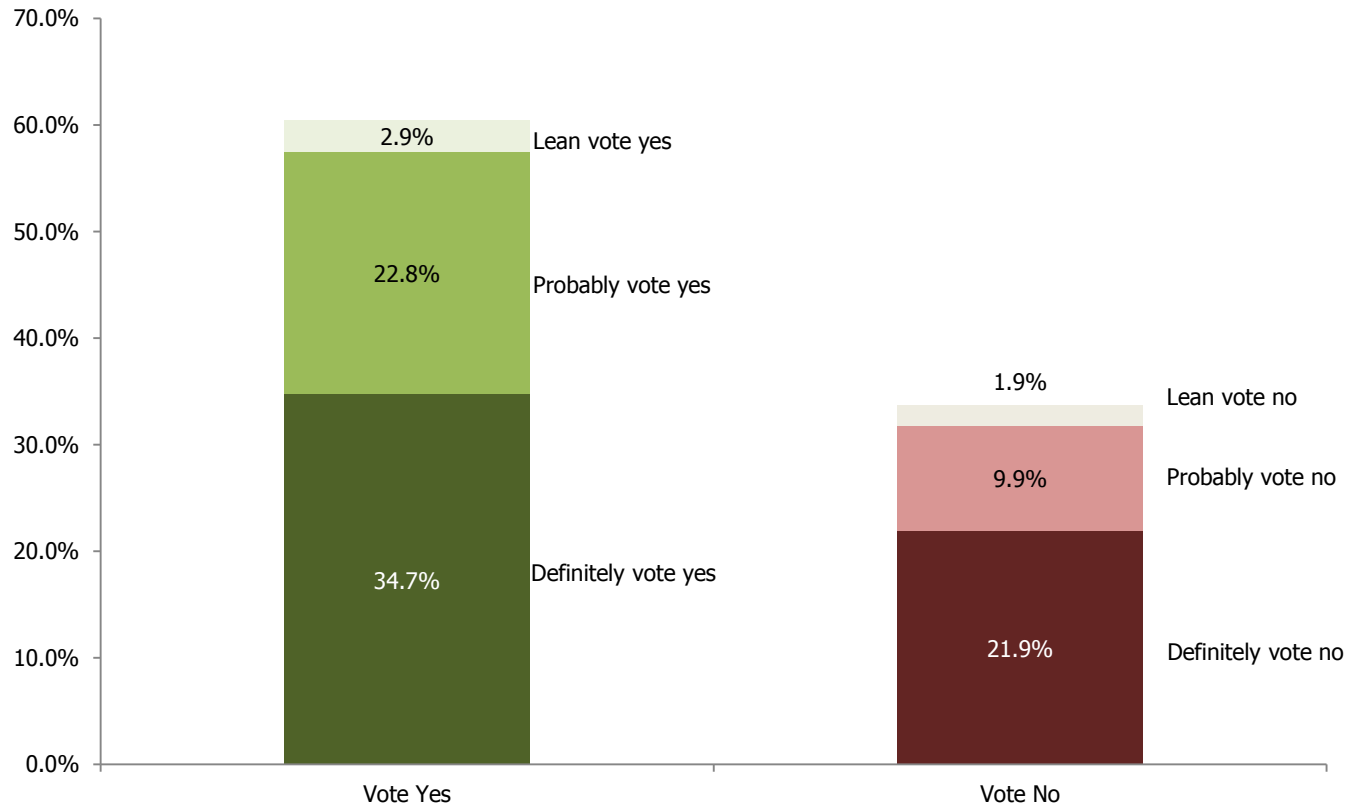
Question: The Safe, Clean and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2012 may come before California voters in the near future. It reads: "To protect water quality and ensure safe, clean drinking water; meet the water supply needs of California residents, farms, businesses, expand water conservation and recycling; restore fish and wildlife habitat; reduce polluted runoff that contaminates rivers, streams, beaches, and bays; and protect the safety of water supplies threatened by earthquakes and other natural disasters; the State of California shall issue bonds totaling eleven billion one hundred forty million dollars paid from existing state funds subject to independent, annual audits, and citizen oversight."

If the election for the Safe, Clean and Reliable Drinking Water Supply Act of 2012 were held today, would you vote Yes to approve or No to reject this initiative?



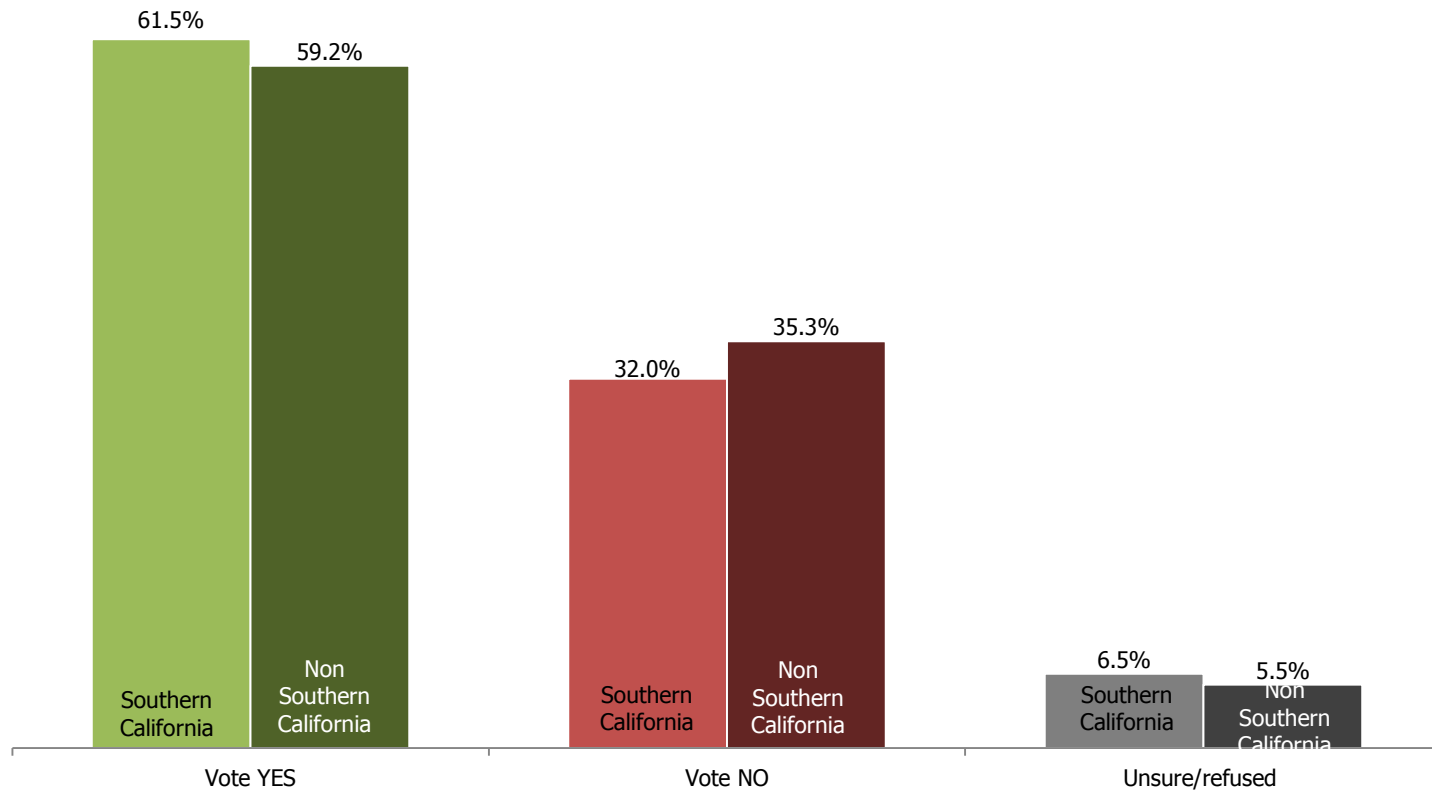
THE INTENSITY OF SUPPORT FOR THE WATER BOND

Is greater than that of the opposition

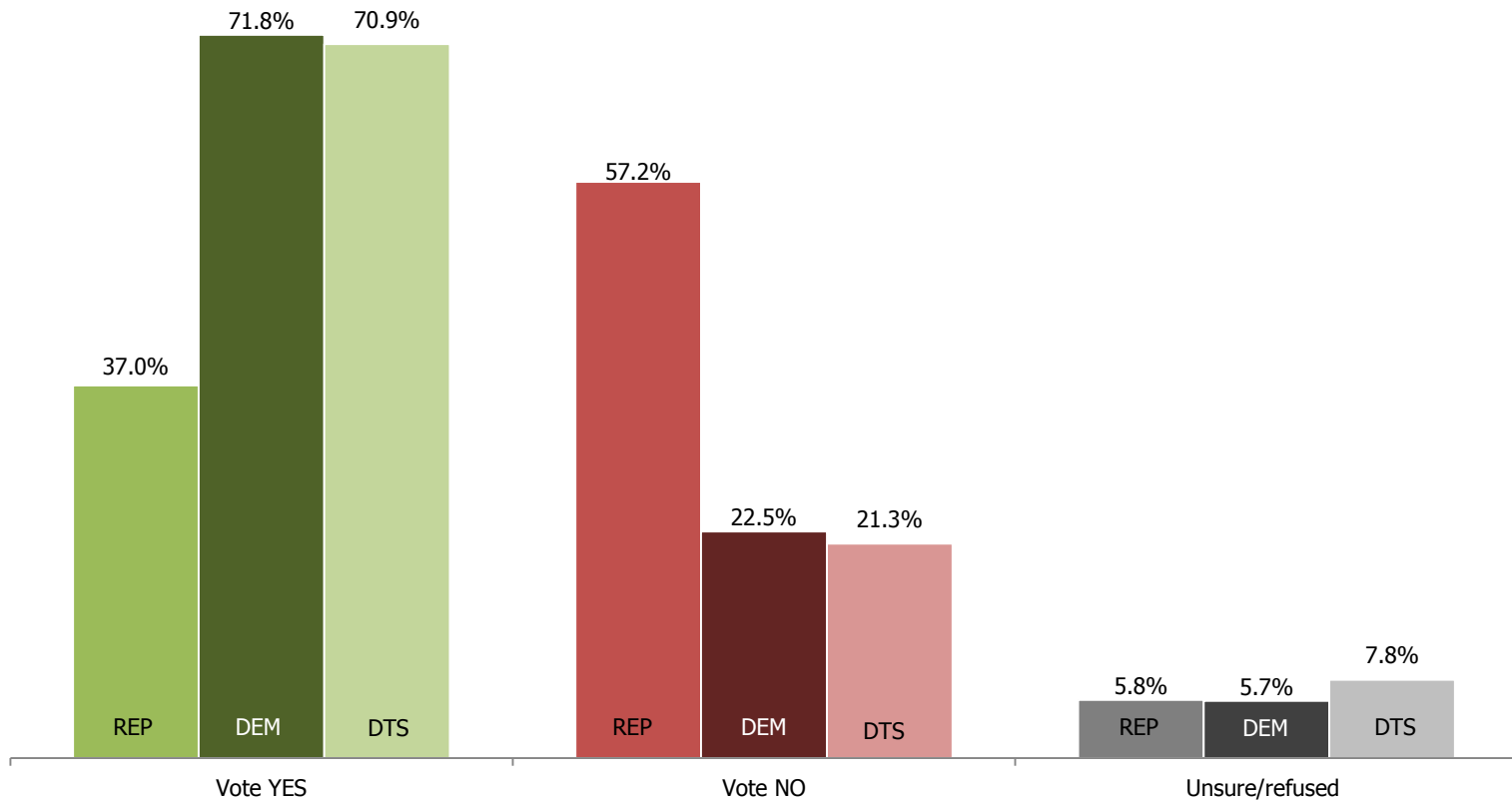


SUPPORT FOR THE WATER BOND IS CONSISTENT

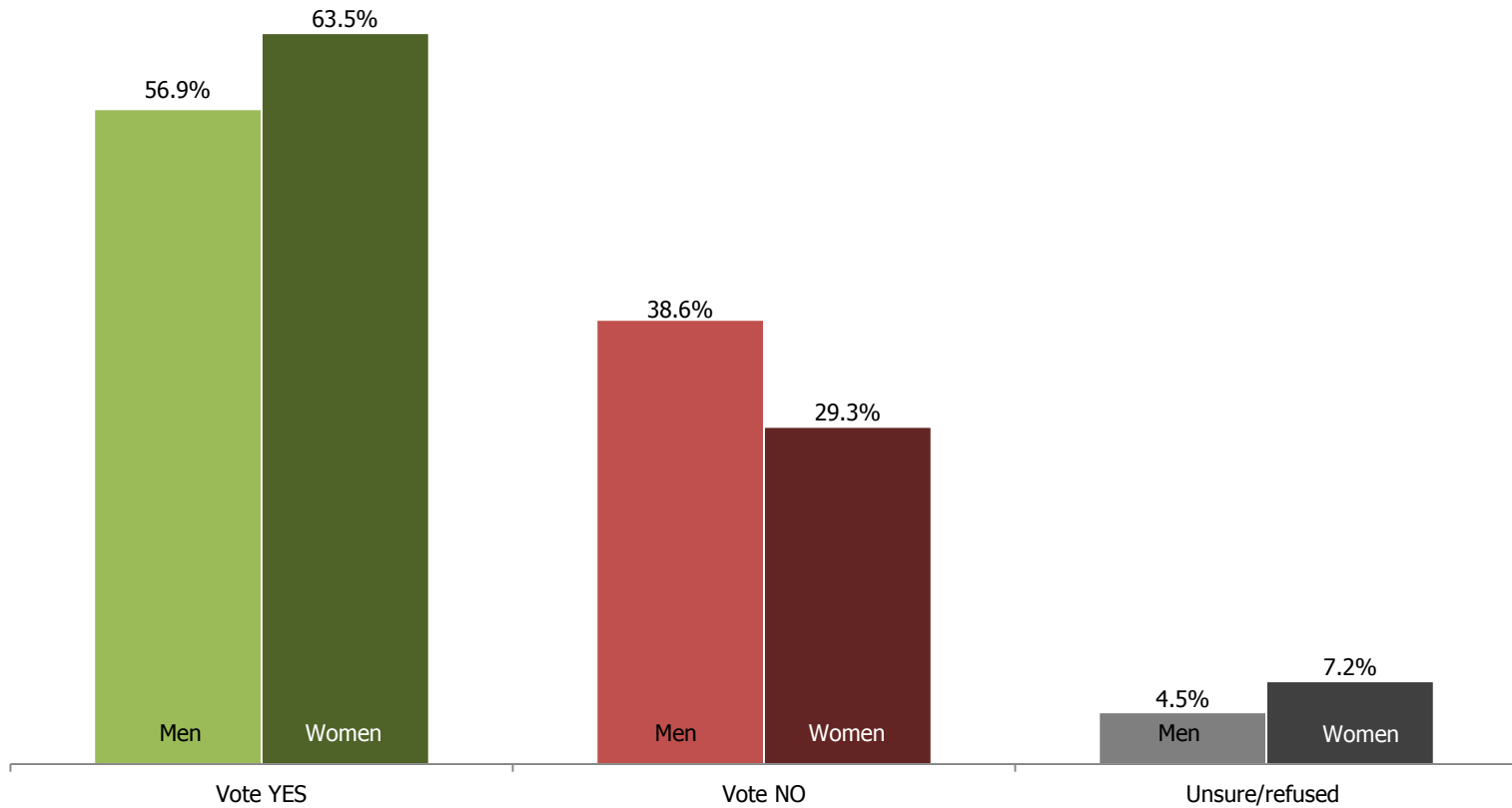
In and outside Southern California



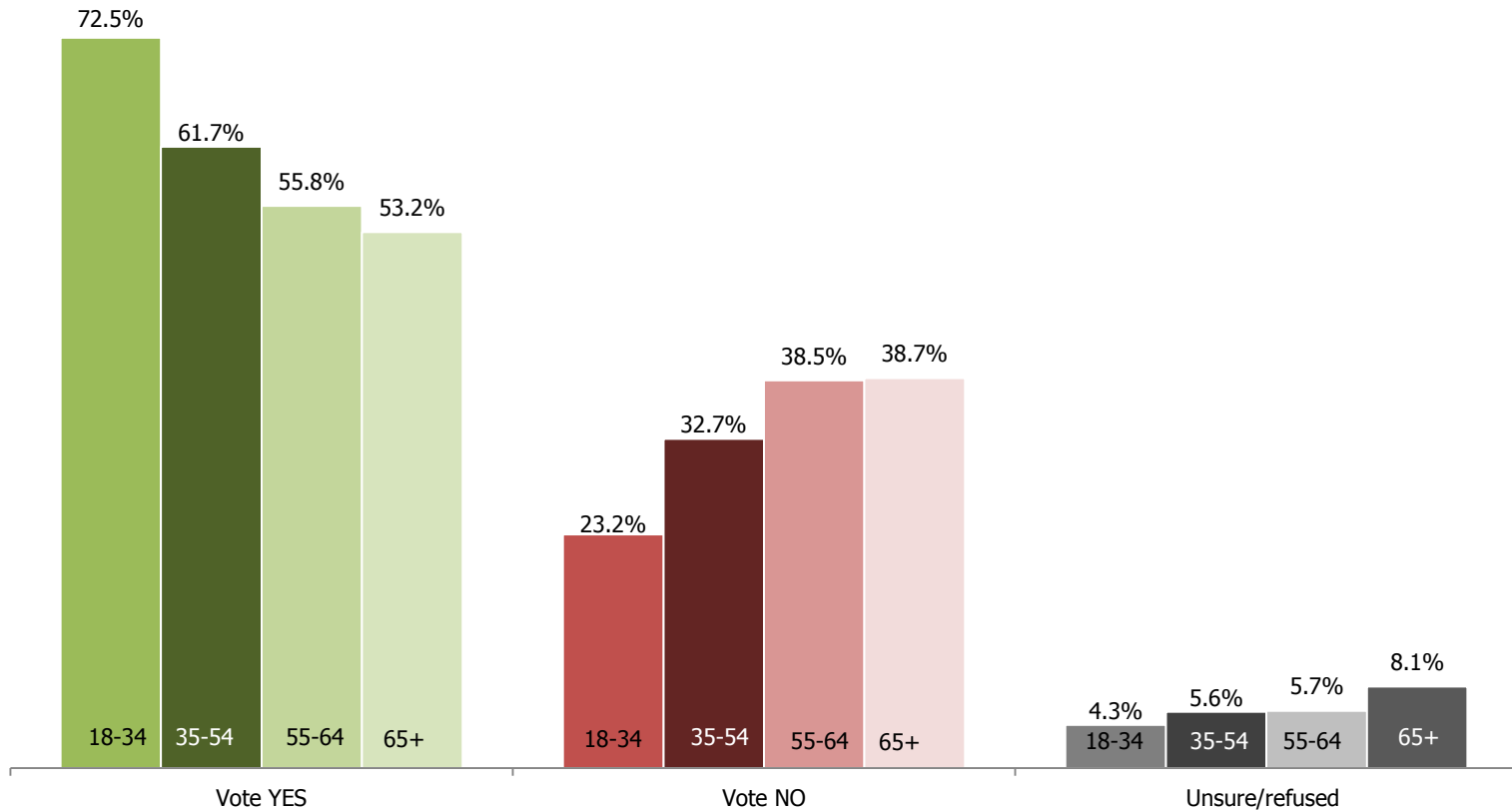
SUPPORT IS GREATER AMONG DEMOCRATIC AND DTS VOTERS Than among Republicans
