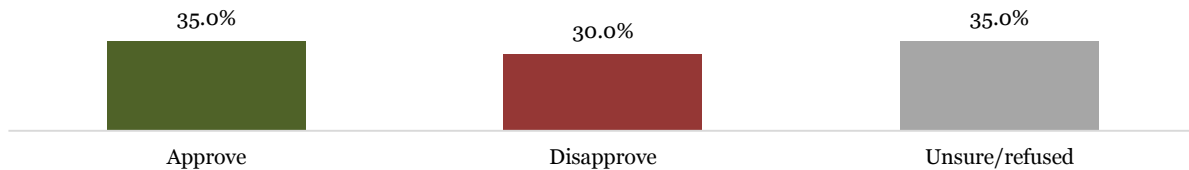

From Friday, June 28 through Monday, July 1, 2013, Probolsky Research conducted a telephone survey of San Diego voters.

VOTERS APPEAR DIVIDED ABOUT MAYOR FILNER

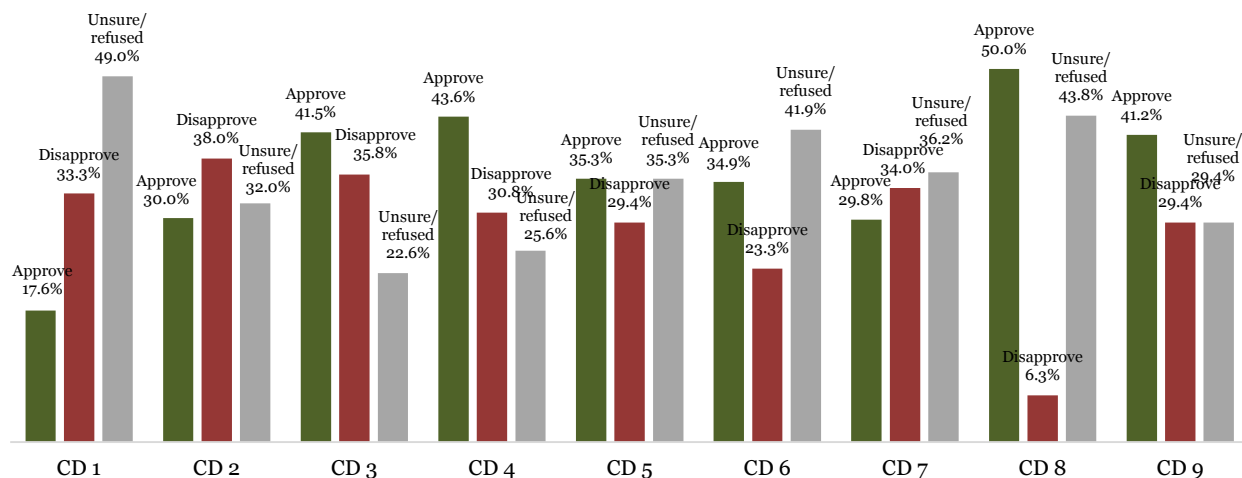
35% approve of the Mayor’s job performance, while 30% disapprove:



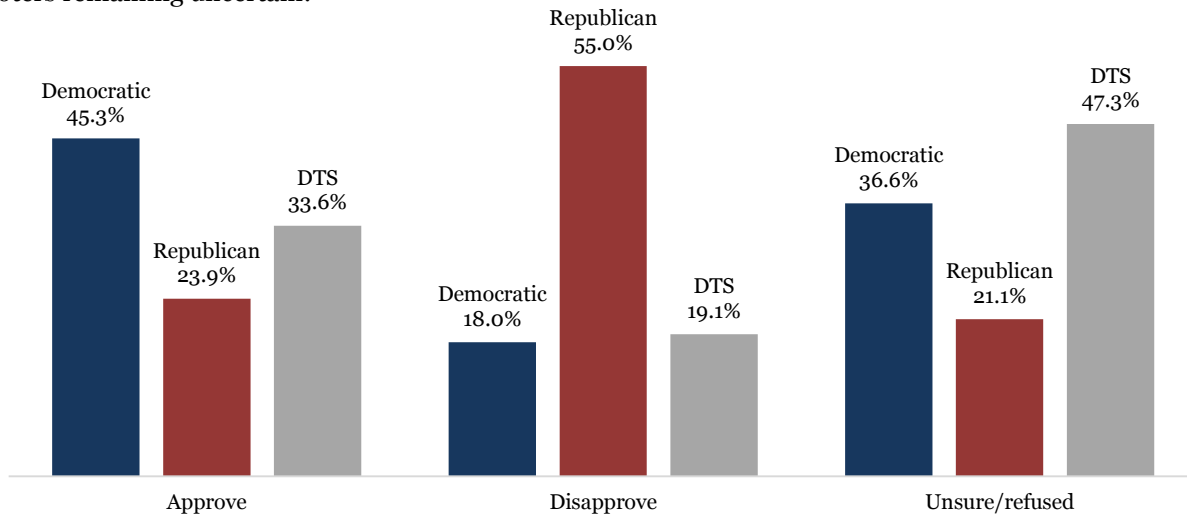
QUESTION: Do you approve or disapprove of the job that San Diego Mayor Bob Filner is doing?

It is notable that the intensity of disapproval significantly outweighs that of approval (20.3% *strongly* disapprove of the Mayor’s job performance, vs. 12.5% who *strongly* approve).

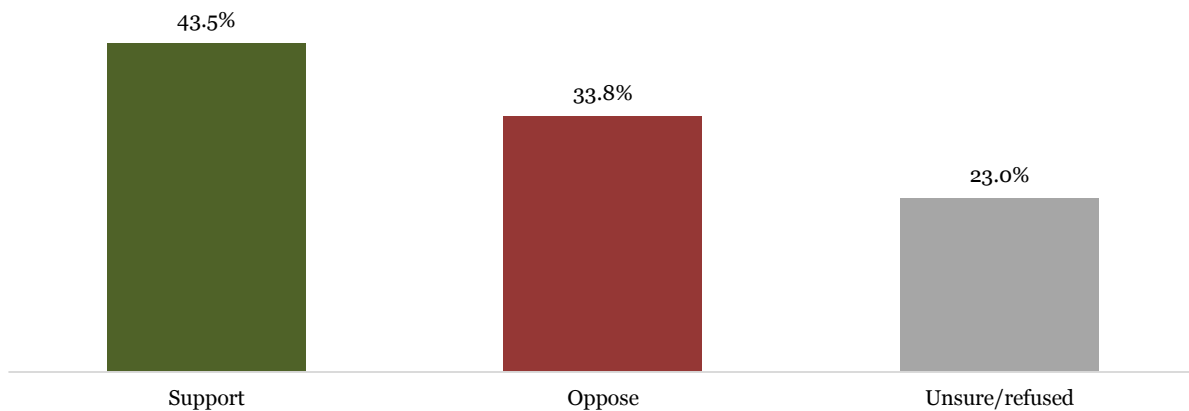
Approval of the Mayor varies considerably by Council District, with Districts 3, 4, 5, 6, 8 and 9 reflecting the greatest approval of the Mayor’s track record, and Districts 1, 2 and 7 reflecting the greatest disapproval:



Support for the Mayor splits largely upon party lines, with a majority of Republicans disapproving of his job performance, a plurality of Democratic voters approving and a plurality of DTS voters remaining uncertain:



A PLURALITY OF VOTERS (43.5%) SUPPORT THE PREVAILING WAGE PROPOSAL THAT IS BEING CONSIDERED BY THE COUNCIL



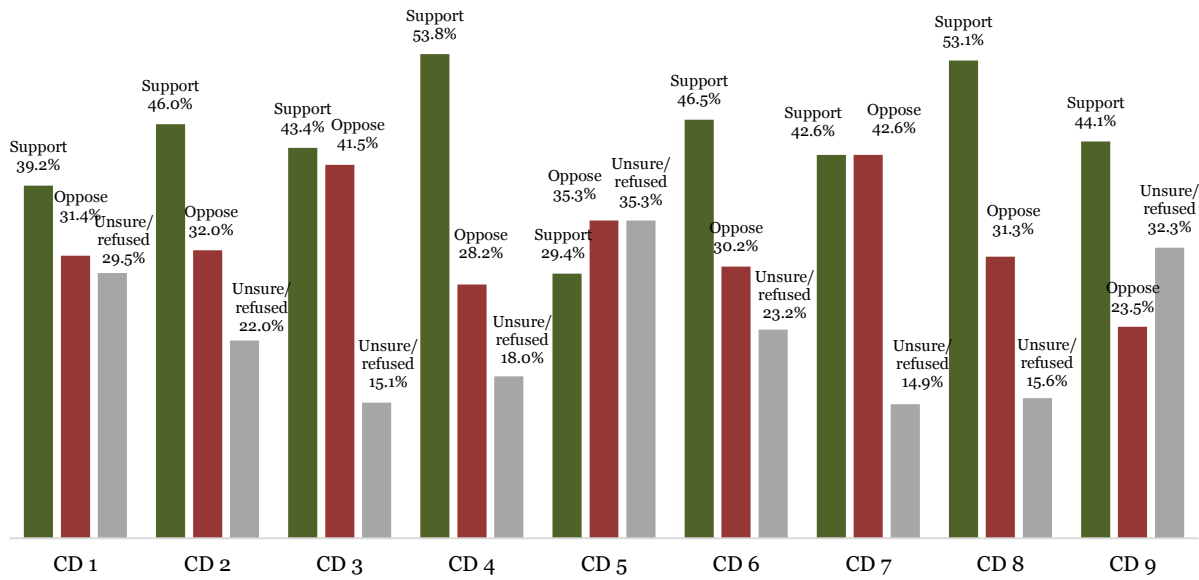
QUESTION: Prevailing wage laws are intended to ensure that the ability of a company to get a public works contract is not based on paying lower wage rates to their workers than a competitor. Local and regional governments with prevailing wage laws in California require bidders on public works contracts to use identical wage rates, which are defined by the State.

The San Diego City Council is considering a proposal to require contractors on City public works and maintenance projects valued over \$25,000 to pay prevailing wages to employees. The City's Independent Budget Analyst estimates that total project costs for the City would rise between five and ten percent, adding between thirteen million and twenty-six million dollars to next year's City budget.

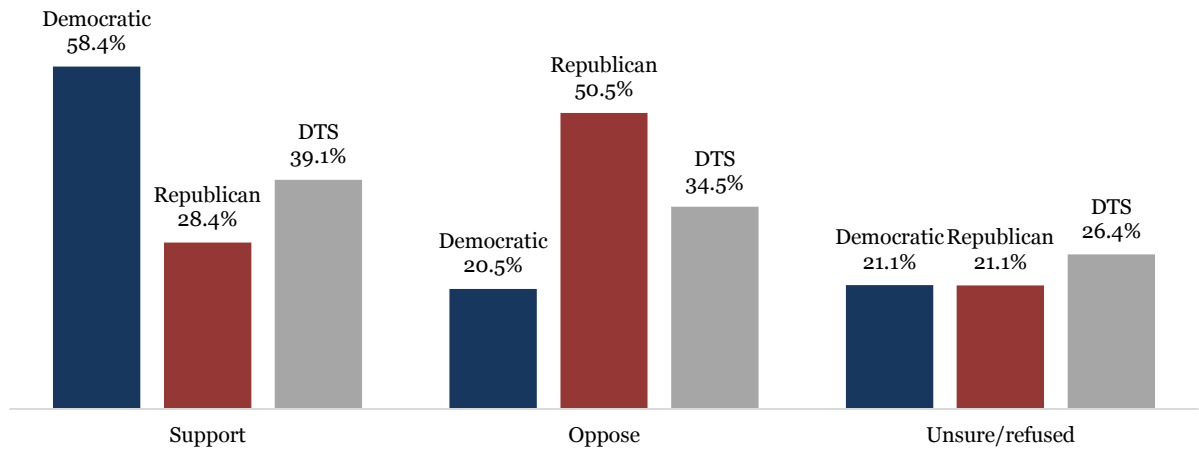
Do you support or oppose the prevailing wage proposal?

The intensity of voter support is nearly identical to that of opposition (19.0% *strongly* support the proposal while 19.8% *strongly* oppose it). That said, support is especially strong in Council Districts 2, 4, 6, 8 and 9:

Support for prevailing wage by Council District



Democratic voters are far more likely to support the prevailing wage proposal than are Republican voters; DTS voters are divided:



A total of 400 surveys were collected. A survey of this size yields a margin of error of +/- 5.0% with a 95% degree of confidence. Interviews were conducted with voters on both landline and cell phones and were offered in English and Spanish languages.
